Vice President's Message

Leadership: It's All about the Calendar



One of my favorite sources for leadership wisdom did not come from a book. It didn't come from a tape, a CD, a video, a speaker, or even off the internet. My favorite source was a calendar. You've seen them... a desk calendar, four and one-half inches square with a pull off page for each day. Some of them have cartoons on them for each day (think the Far Side), others have pictures of works of art (think Picasso).

The year was 1993 and the calendar was from Zig Ziglar. Most days had such "good stuff" that I could not throw the pages away after I ripped them off. I still have them on my desk and from time to time I leaf through them to remind myself of these nuggets. Among them:

- Anything worth doing is worth doing poorly until you learn to do it well.
- Motivation follows the action.
- Logic will not change an emotion, but action will.
- Motivation creates energy.
- If you encounter difficulty, don't change your decision to go. Change your direction to get there.
- Work hard and become a leader; be lazy and never succeed. (Proverbs 12:24)
- The difference between doing and not doing is measured in minute amounts.
- Don't confuse activity with accomplishment.

I think my favorite quotes deal with motivation. How many times have you heard a child, a spouse, or even a co-worker, say "I just can't get motivated"? I need to clean up my room, but I just can't get motivated! I need to pay the bills but I just can't get motivated. I need to return calls to clients, but I just can't get motivated.

The amazing realization I had in 1993 was that action often precedes motivation. Really, it's quite remarkable how I could be dreading doing a certain activity until I started it. Once I cleaned the first spot, paid the first bill, made that first call there often was a rush of adrenalin that would carry me to do more than I ever expected. The lesson was: don't wait on motivation -- start the action and the motivation will follow.

So, if you are still reading, I challenge you (in the best sense of the word) to act now. If you have not had an opportunity to be a part of a Leadership Scott County class, then take time today to download the application from the Chamber's website, complete it and send it in. Don't wait on the "urge" to hit you. Do it now. If you have been a part of LSC then I ask that you to find someone else to encourage to apply. Applications are due June 30... but don't wait on the motivation.

LSC is full of action and motivation. From August to April each year twenty or more LSC participants take part in a class day each month. While the days are built around themes (Agriculture, History, Education, Health, Government, Industry, and Public Service) that are relevant to our city and county, the leadership focus is on making connections -- connections to the people and organizations that make a difference in our community. Each class also participates in a community service project that enhances some aspect Georgetown/Scott County.

Read the testimonials in this newsletter from past classmates and add Leadership Scott County to your calendar for 2011/2012. I guarantee it will leave you more motivated than even my 1993 calendar left me.
